On October 16, we were asked to appear in Superior Court, and the Endowment Fund was restored to the care of the cemetery. Our current board has been working on both getting a license and regaining control of the Endowment Fund for the last five years. It is most gratifying—and exciting—to have the state and the court acknowledge our efforts to restore the cemetery to a healthy operating status.

Our historic cemetery is ready to serve our community with 700 full plots and several thousand cremation

spaces.

The cemetery office is open from 8 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Monday to Friday. Special appointments may be made by calling the office at 209 -823-8533. If you have an existing pre-need, we encourage you to stop by during business hours with your documentation to ensure our records are up to date.

What is an endowment care fund?

A cemetery **endowment care** trust **fund** is designed to ensure that income will always be available for the continued maintenance and upkeep of the cemetery, even when all the interment spaces are sold. **At NO time is the principal allowed to be withdrawn.** The interest, however, may be used for the maintenance and embellishment of the cemetery grounds.
