"Restoring, and Preserving, our cemetery and its history for future generations"

President's Message by Janice Zacharias

I still have trouble explaining to people why I'm the president of a cemetery board—I get some odd looks. But the satisfaction comes from being able to work with some of the best volunteers anywhere! We have twelve diverse and dedicated people, along with veterans from both the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars who willingly donate their time digging graves, making repairs, doing landscape or cement work, or anything else they are asked to do. We have spoken many times to each other about what pulls us here, and I think it's because we want to honor those who came before us, preserve the sacred spaces where they are buried, and solve some of the mysteries of incomplete or inaccurate records. We've become pretty good detectives!

We have had so many wonderful things happen during the three+ years we have dedicated to this project. One of the most important was the creation of a cemetery map. We walked the entire cemetery, row by row, and wrote down each marker we saw. We then crossreferenced what we could see with the records that had been found in the cemetery garage [about 40 sets of old records in various stages of preservation] to make as complete a burial record for each individual as we could. Steve Stroud and Janet Fiore installed Pontem softwareon the office computer in order to computerize our findings. We have worked with the California Cemetery and Funeral Bureau to successfully assist numerous families each year with a pre-need contract before 2008 [when the cemetery license was revoked] to bury their loved ones, all with the assistance of volunteers.

We are continuing to work on site improvements, as there will be a physical inspection of our maps, grounds, and office by a field representative from the Cemetery and Funeral Board. We will probably shout it from the rooftops when our license is finally granted—so many people have worked so hard to get to this point, and we are all very excited to once again be able to serve our community.

Many of you have noticed other construction going on, and we're excited about it! Thanks to a very generous bequest by Tsuneko Leonard, we are in the midst of getting all new asphalt roads, and a beautiful wrought-iron fence with electronic gates. There are often many delays in construction—since we didn't have accurate maps of the old irrigation system, many pipes and electrical connections were broken and repaired over the last couple of months. But everything is now in good shape, and we are ready to proceed—it should be fun to watch.



Other improvements have been made to our buildings and grounds with the help of Eagle Scout Projects. Spencer Brammel canvassed the cemetery, working with old records to determine where many unmarked baby graves were located. Spencer Ogden surveyed the cemetery, found and glued about 40 loose cement headstones to their bases, and raised and leveled out 15-20 more headstones. Spencer Oberman took on two painting projects, updating the trim and doors of the cemetery office to a lovely shade of green, and repainting all of the wrought iron-windows, fence, and gazebo—a shiny new black. [Yes, we had three Scouts each named Spencer!]

Joshua Taylor took on the huge project of re-siding the pump house, which involved removing/replacing all the old siding, painting it and the trim to match the office, installing a new door and deadbolt, and making some small electrical repairs. We love our Eagle Scouts! They have fundraisers or get donations to pay for their project, inspire others to help them work, and have been respectful and eager to find ways to help and preserve our
