150th Anniversary

The cemetery in 2022 celebrated its 150th anniversary. We threw a big party in September, featuring a walking tour with biographies of locally famous or interesting people; a "History Hunt" was held; and a raffle was conducted. Historic cemetery documents were on display on the patio, along with a "Tell Me about your Family" booth, and a BBQ hot dog lunch with drinks and cake was enjoyed by all.

Also featured was the initial phase of the long-awaited columbaria project, including the recently finished cement pad, planter areas, and the Veteran's Plaza wall - complete with military flags and seals. We were able to restore the original veteran's plaque at the base of the U.S. flag., and our local VFW and American Legion volunteers, led by Rocky Wilson, officially raised the flags over the memorial.

As background, when we started volunteering in 2014 we were aware of about 165 veterans interred. Through diligent work, Janet Fiore discovered that EUCA has 482 – and counting – veterans buried here, including vets from the Civil War, both World Wars, and almost every conflict since.

When we realized that our veterans accounted for almost 15% of those buried here, it became very important to create a more substantial memorial, in order to better honor veterans and other patriots in our community. The old veteran's plaque preserved, and once again sits at the base of our U.S. flag.





As seen on the fundraising thermometer, we have already raised over \$113,000! Those funds paid for the cement plaza, which is the base for the future columbaria; the Veteran's memorial wall; landscaping, lighting, and bubblers; and the military seals. The cost for the purchase and installation of the five above-ground columbaria that will surround the pictured memorial is approximately \$160,000 – fundraising continues!



- 1. Tiles may contain four lines of text with up to 25 characters per line including spaces.
- 2. Messages on the tiles may include the name of the Honored, date of birth and passing, and a brief message. Veteran's tiles may include branch of service, rank, campaigns served, and/or decorations.
- 3. No foul or offensive language will be allowed. All tile messages must be approved by Friends of the Cemetery (Friends) staff.
- 4. Only tiles supplied by Friends will be allowed. Font will be standard for all tiles.
- 5. Tiles will be placed on the Memorial wall in the order they are received.
- Individuals purchasing multiple tiles may request that all tiles purchased at the same time be grouped together.
- 6. Individuals purchasing Memorial tiles will be notified via text or email when the tile has been mounted on the memorial wall.













